Re: Public Records Act Request

Dear Mr. Bluestone:

The Clerk of the Board of Supervisors received your Public Records Act ("Act") request on June 27, 2013 requesting various documents relating to the intersection of Howell Mountain Road and Lloyd Drive in Napa County between January 1, 1990 and the present. This office represents the Clerk of the Board and is providing a timely response to your request under Government Code Section 6253(c).

Government Code Section 6253(c) provides as follows: "Each agency, upon a request for a copy of records, shall, within 10 days from receipt of the request, determine whether the request, in whole or in part, seeks copies of disclosable public records in the possession of the agency and shall promptly notify the person making the request of the determination and the reasons therefore. In unusual circumstances, the time limit prescribed in this section may be extended by written notice...to the person making the request, setting forth the reasons for the extension and the date on which a determination is expected to be dispatched. No notice shall specify a date that would result in an extension for more than 14 days."

This response therefore serves as written notice of the need for an extension of time. The reasons for the extension include the need to search for and collect the requested record from field facilities or other establishments that are separate from the office processing the request

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(Gov. Code Section 6253(c)(1)); the need to search for, collect, and appropriately examine a voluminous amount of records that are demanded in a single request (Gov. Code Section 6253(c)(2)); and the need for consultation, which shall be conducted with all practicable speed, with among two or more components of the agency having substantial subject matter interest therein (Gov. Code Section 6253(c)(3)).

We have initiated the processing of your request to identify records and determine if any records are exempt from disclosure pursuant to Government Code Section 6254. We anticipate a determination to be dispatched no later than **July 22, 2013**, the last day allowed by the fourteen (14) day extension from the initial deadline, which will inform you of the anticipated date when any disclosable records will be made available for your review or copying, the copying charges if known, and the explanation for not disclosing any exempt records. We reserve the right to object to certain records you have requested.
